

SEPTEMBER 3, 2023

Dear Parishioners,

September 2nd and 3rd is Labor Day weekend. This is the unofficial end of summer. We now move into what we call the academic year. I always notice that in September and October there are a lot of activities that take up people's time. We live an even more frantic existence than

we normally do. Taking care of ourselves spiritually falls down the priority list. Our spiritual self needs care just as our physical and mental self does.

I remember just a couple short years ago during the pandemic, we were all forced to stay home. We had more time to just be with our family and to relax with them without a lot of organized activities constantly pulling us in every direction. Life and death issues grabbed our attention. Many people said, we need to learn some lessons from this experience to apply to our lives when the pandemic recedes.

We might ponder these issues as the school year starts and our fall and winter schedules begin. Is all the business worth it? Does life pass by without time to savor things? When recreational activities and vacations become a lot of work is there something wrong?

Our Judeo-Christian tradition has a commandment which says we are to keep the sabbath day holy. The sabbath was always a day to spend listening to the Lord and resting in his embrace. We might ask on Labor Day, when is my sabbath and how do I keep it? Do I set boundaries on my activities and keep them so I may have time for prayer and reflection? These questions are at the heart of religious practice. We benefit from asking them.


