Dear Parishioners,

This weekend at our 11:00 a.m. Mass we are celebrating the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

Sometimes people ask if they should receive this sacrament. The church has tried to make this sacrament more available to people for the last 50 years. At the beginning of the church's history anointing with holy oil was one of the only remedies for those who were ill. There was not the vast array of medical treatments there are today. The church and its ministers were some of the primary health care workers. Later, the absolution from sin that the sacrament provides was emphasized. Because of that, celebrating the sacrament did not happen until someone was in danger of death.

Today, we say that all Catholics who have a chronic disease, who are facing a serious illness or who are elderly can be anointed. We anoint children who have received First Reconciliation and Communion. Sometimes people ask if they can be anointed if they have a psychological illness. The answer would be yes. We know today that psychological illness is tied to physical illness most of the time.

I encourage anyone who feels drawn to the sacrament to be anointed during Mass.

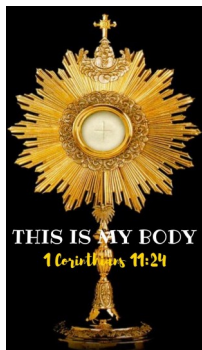

Altar and Rosary Meeting





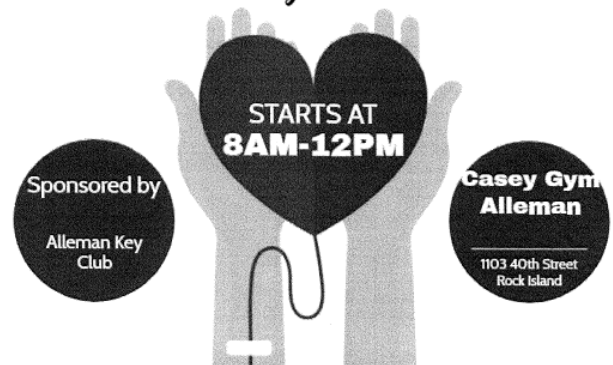
