5) Community	Show love and respect to God, everyone and ourselves Appreciate the different groups to which we belong Develop a sense of belonging to our parish community. Participate in special events with the parish holiday customs, blessings, and social events.  Become aware of ministries in the parish	
6) Missionary Spirit	Be able to perform good acts and give our best to others. Be like Jesus, serving others Practice the spiritual and corporal works of mercy. Be open to God's invitation to the priesthood or religious life.
