The Sacrament of Confirmation is a completion of initiation, a call to each Catholic to grow in faith and witness and an empowerment through the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit.

The Sacrament of Eucharist, the center of sacramental life, is the real presence of Jesus consecrated by an ordained minister (the priest or bishop). It is a nourishing, strengthening, and unifying source for the people of God.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a celebration of God's forgiveness, an absolution of our sins, and a reunion between us and God (and His Church).

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick extends the healing of Christ to the seriously ill, takes away sin through the grace of the Holy Spirit, relieves and strengthens the soul of the sick person, and sometimes restores bodily health.

The Sacrament of Matrimony is a celebration of life-long love and commitment between a man and a woman, a reflection of the covenant of indissoluble love between Christ and the Church, and an empowerment for the couple to be love-giving and life-giving.

The Sacrament of Holy Orders is a permanent sign of Christ's presence through the priest, a primary means of the sacramental presence of Christ and a celebration of the three orders of bishop, priest, and deacon.
