



## CELEBRATING OUR PAST, LOOKING TO THE FUTURE





The 100th anniversary of the dedication of Sacred Heart Church will be in April of 2023. As I look back at the history of our parish, I am struck by where our parish was financially when our church was dedicated in 1923. The parish leadership wanted to have a "worthy" church where the liturgy could be celebrated, and they borrowed money to achieve that goal. It was the roaring twenties and things were prosperous. Little did they know that the Great Depression would arrive in 1929. The church loan was not paid off for 20 years. I say that to put our present financial situation in context.

The fiscal year 2020 - 2021 was a wonderful year for our finances. Our endowment grew. We collected money from our TTT campaign, and we got money from a government PPP loan. We ended the year by re-roofing the north end of Culemans Memorial Hall, working on the gutters for our church, and updating the parking lot on the east side of our campus. These were projects that could not be deferred.

The bills for these capital improvements came due at the beginning of 2021 - 2022. We knew this would cause our operating budget for 2021-2022 to be in the red. We used money from savings and from our endowment to offset costs. The stock market

has been bearish for the last six months, so our endowment lost significant value. But we continued to collect money for the Today Tomorrow Together Campaign and we even surpassed our goal. So, we have a mixed bag of news to present to you this fiscal year.

One thing I would like to emphasize is that parish collections stayed about the same. We need to see that number grow. School assessments continue to rise, and other costs do as well.

I have not given you a lot of numbers. The financial numbers are included in the report elsewhere in this newsletter. We are being as transparent as we can. Like the parishioners of 100 years ago, we face uncertain times. In the coming year, we will dedicate the addition to our church. This is an act of faith. Let's pray that God will

continue to provide for the needs of our parish. I thank you for your continued generosity.

# A CLOSER LOOK: PARISH FINANCES

Our Sacred Heart Finance Committee would like to share with you a summary of our financial performance for the year which ended June 30, 2022. In our continued spirit of transparency, we present this detailed review.

While this year's report does not reflect the financial prosperity we had last year, we remain encouraged. The year ended with a loss, meaning that expenses exceeded income by \$269,949 before accounting for our TTT Capital Campaign donations and expenditures. We will work hard to make sure that next year we return to a financial result that is "in the black." We are incredibly grateful for the continued generosity of our parishioners, the leadership of our pastor, Fr. Mark, and the hard work of our parish staff.

Overall parish income was \$1,070,129 without TTT donations, which is \$61,336 below budget projections. Total income was less than last year by \$21,218 when TTT donations are excluded. Offertory collections were the same as last year. Included in total income is \$61,000 of extraordinary income from the forgiveness of a PPP Small Business Loan. This program has ended. It will be important to replace those funds with other sources, primarily collections from parish members.

Realized parish expenses for the year totaled \$1,116,396. This is \$9,923 less than budget, due to much-needed repairs which were not part of the TTT campaign, return to normal activities, increased utility costs, and inflation. General expenses were up \$41,000 from last year. Details of these expenses are shown in the accompanying report.

Two of Sacred Heart's major expenses are the subsidies we provide to Seton Catholic School and Alleman Catholic High School. Over \$486,000 is dedicated to ensuring our schools remain healthy and continue to provide a quality education program enriched by teaching our Catholic faith.

After a couple of years when many of our ministries have been restricted due to health and safety precautions, we look forward to welcoming volunteers who offer their time and talents to keep our expenses low. Please consider helping with the Garden Committee, the Cleaning Crew, Art and Environment Committee, Facilities Advisory Committee, and the Altar and Rosary Society. We also thank the Catholic Order of Foresters who generously save us thousands of dollars each year. Many thanks to all who graciously volunteer.

Our "Today, Tomorrow, Together" capital campaign raised \$894,598 in 2021-2022. With \$2,924,375 in funds raised in total over the last four years, our campus proudly reflects the improvements made possible by your generous support. Your gifts have allowed us to complete tuck pointing of the church exterior, complete restoration of our beautiful stained-glass windows, replace the HVAC in the Lee Parish Center, relocate the rectory into the Lee Parish Center, and demolish the old rectory. We are now focused on completing the final part of our campaign which will provide an addition to the church to meet current and future needs.

In this time of uncertainty, your continued financial support has been vital to our ability to address the needs of our parish and school. We thank you for your support and your sacrifice.

We are grateful for the opportunity to serve the parishioners of Sacred Heart. Please continue to pray for God's blessings on our parish.
